CG: Darren Berman, MD Nationwide Children's Hospital	Dr. Berman talks about Zoey's history - "She underwent her first heart surgery at about 3 months of age and that was to improve and increase the amount of blood flow that was going into her lungs." Dr. Berman talks about the issues with Zoey's lungs - "The pressure in her lung arteries was significantly elevated, and it was that high pressure in her lung arteries that was really preventing her from undergoing the next step in surgery."	

	Dr. Berman talks about what he saw during the catheter exam - "What we saw was that when we temporarily block that tube that was a little bit big for her, that those higher transmitted pressures actually fell and came down into a very safe and acceptable level." Dr. Berman talks about steps he took to help her during catheter - "We determined that by giving her a little bit more oxygen and plugging off that shunt, that she would be, actually much more stable."
	Dr. Berman talks about Zoey's infectious personality - "She is an energetic, hilarious little girl. She will make a room laugh, just by the way she interacts with you."
	Tori talks about the day her daughter was put on the waitlist - "The hospital here said that there was nothing else they could do for her. Her heart function had gotten so bad and her lungs were not functioning very well either."
	Tori talks about Zoey's recovery from procedures at Nationwide - "They told us they we would be up there 6-8 weeks after surgery for recovery. So, I moved, got an apartment up there, you know. We were home, back in Nashville, in this home - at our home - in 10 days!"
	Tori talks about Zoey's progress - "Her progress lately has been amazing."
CG: Tori Goddard Zoey's mom	"She has learned to walk by herself, and doctors told us she would never walk. And she's walking unassisted now."
	"We have been able to wean her vent significantly, up to the point now where we're actually starting to come off of it."
	"We had an echo done a couple weeks ago and her cardiologist here was amazed. She was like 'Her left ventricle function is back to normal."
	Tori talks about her appreciation for each day with Zoey - "You really do try to say 'Hey, we're not guaranteed tomorrow. So, let's live today."
	Tori talks about her hopes for Zoey - "You know, I hope that she's happy. That's really our biggest thing."
