Dr. Patel says a wish gives a kid a break from their illness: "Many of these children live with these chronic illnesses and so they only have this as their identity, and a wish gives them an opportunity to say, 'I can be a kid. I can focus on something other than what's ailing me."

CG: Anup Patel, MD Nationwide Children's Hospital Dr. Patel describes how Cimone was different after her trip: "When she came back she just seemed different to me. She was lighter, she was happier. She was actually even more confident."

Dr. Patel says wishes improve health and reduce costs: "We're able to say for the first time, a wish is was more than just a nice thing to do. A wish is something that potentially can help the health of a child get better over time, and also healthcare utilization and spending and dollars as it's spent on healthcare can get better over time by doing this."

Cimone says she's glad her health is getting better: "It's a good feeling know that, you know, I might not need those emergency meds and that I'm going in the right path."

Cimone says she was happier after her trip to Paris: "I came back happier than ever, like there was a smile on my face."

Cimone says it's amazing how much she has improved: "How much I've improved, it's great, it's amazing."

Cimone states her wish and why she chose it: "The wish I made was to go to Paris, France, and that's because I like, I love travelling."

Tonisha says experiencing Paris changed Cimone's life:

"It wasn't until we got there and she got to experience life outside of herself, life outside of epilepsy, life outside of her small school and town that we live in that, I think, just opened up for her, a whole new life."

Tonisha says Cimone is reaching her goals thanks to her wish: "She has set goals for her life, and she works every day towards those goals, and that's what that wish did."

Tonisha explains how Cimone was struggling before her trip: "She was battling depression. She was battling all of these seizure, and then the effects from the medication. I mean, she just was going through so much."
